The latter part of 2024 saw a considerable rise in the PMS membership, in the most part due to publicity gained at the Gather in the Dolphin Centre. Fortunately, the additional income gained from sales and membership meant that the extra cost of water, insurance, electrical certification etc was more than covered. Rent is down on 2023 as we did not hire the hall on Saturdays as in winter 2023. 2024 saw an increase in the use of the workshop and a rise in the amount of money spent on tool maintenance, materials and power consumption. Cost of tools alone in 2024 is down. During 2024 average weekly attendance was 36 and donations received at the door was £1,756. Wednesday's snacks, ie biscuits, chips, sausage rolls, onion rings, coffee and milk etc., cost just shy of £600. All of these donations qualify for Gift Aid which is why I ask that one writes their name clearly in the "Signing in" book; from there I can then allocate these donations to the relevant person and reclaim 25% in Gift Aid from HMRC.

Though I anticipate insurance, rent, water and electricity to increase in 2025 I believe we will remain comfortable and therefore annual subs will remain unchanged at £25. During 2024, several costs such as purchase of machinery, parts for the lathe, completion of building work and certification were one off payments so our balance sheet should look as healthy if not better in 2025. The large increase in the sum spent on materials is due to materials for all projects, eg raised beds, soil, timber and polytunnels etc., plus PMS requirements, all being shown as one total. These costs are ultimately recovered from the relevant sponsors and donors. The increase in 'Buildings' was due to completion of ceilings and electrical work in the workshops including the electrical certification.

Due to more members acknowledging and signing Gift Aid forms our return from HMRC has risen from £585 for 2022 to £820 for 2023. Gift Aid for both these years was received in 2024. If you wish to sign up to Gift Aid, the only criteria is that you must be a tax payer and the amount of tax you pay should be more than 25% of your total donations. No action is required other than signing the form!
